## SPEAKER BIOS

#### Session 1 - Sick society: reimagining how we live well together

#### SPEAKER Dr Andy Knox MBE

Andy is a husband, a dad, a son, a brother, and a friend. He's also a GP in Carnforth, Lancashire and the Associate Medical Director for the Lancashire and South Cumbria Integrated Health and Care Partnership. His work is particularly focused on improving population health and tackling health inequalities. He was previously Director of Population Health for Morecambe Bay. He is an associate in population health at both the King's Fund and the Centre for Population Health, and senior lecturer in sociology and health at Lancaster University. He's a member of the NHS National Assembly, a Director of the Well Communities CIC, Vice-Chair of the South Westmorland Multi-Academy Trust, and a member of the Poverty Truth Commission.



#### Session 2 - Agitators for good: influencing the public debate

#### SPEAKER Steve Taylor

Dr Steve Taylor has been a GP in Prestwich, Manchester since 1994. A GP partner and GP trainer for 27 years, more recently he has been working as a GP locum whilst advocating for the NHS and General Practice in particular. For the past year he has been a GP spokesperson for Doctors Association UK having been approached by them to support the work they do. He uses statistics and data in helping demonstrate the importance of the issues in the NHS and gaining better insights. Steve is the Lead Elder at South Manchester Family Church.
